Additionally, applicants are evaluated with respect to their interest and awareness of issues and concerns in the youth community, willingness to read and evaluate complex grant applications, potential for leadership, dedication to volunteering in their community, and unique qualities they will bring to CAYAC. Selected applicants will be invited to an informational interview to ensure that they understand the full responsibilities of CAYAC membership.
