GHACF team member Cora Russ is participating in the Chamber's 2025-2026 Leadership Connect program, which combines leadership training and community awareness.

The educational sessions provide skills training to participants to help them lead more effectively, enhance contributions to their organizations, and aid in improving the quality of life in Northwest Ottawa County.

Nearly \$650k Awarded Through Community Impact Grants

Nearly \$650,000 in grants were recently distributed to five organizations in our community. The **Outdoor Discovery Center** which was awarded \$250,000 to support the transformation of Mary A. White Elementary into the Duneside Discovery Center, is a nature-based early childhood education center. Funding will help create nature playscapes, interactive outdoor learning environments, trails, comprehensive landscaping, and habitat restoration efforts such as dune and meadow revitalization, native landscaping, and tree planting. Many outdoor areas will be accessible to the public, benefiting the greater community. Other grants awarded include:

- **Hand2Hand** was granted \$31,000 in support of facility upgrades to ensure efficient operations and the ability to meet growing demand. Our Coopersville and Allendale Foundation affiliates also contributed \$2,000 each to help the cause, so students in need can enjoy nutritious meals over the weekends and on extended school breaks.
- Tri-Cities Family YMCA received a \$63,000 grant to aid in expanding their Learning Tree Preschool program at their West Michigan Academy of Arts and Academics location. Funding will help address growing local demand, improve school readiness, support working families, and enhance long-term educational outcomes for children in northwest Ottawa County.
- **Spring Lake Public Schools** was awarded a \$73,290 grant to support Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) across the district, with the

goal of building a sustainable system of collaboration that ensures high levels of learning for all students, fosters a thriving educational community, and improves teacher support and retention.

• Lakeshore Advantage Foundation received a grant of \$225,000 over 3 years (up to \$75,000 per year) to take on the next phase of the Housing Next initiative, addressing access to affordable housing in Ottawa County. Funding will support hiring a Community Development Director to sustain momentum built over the past eight years and ensure housing strategies and solutions remain proactive and locally responsive.
