Ray and Sue Barrett Scholarship





Scholarship**



Dake Community Manufacturing Scholarship Fund





Scholarship Fund**



Scott A. Flahive 1966-1994


Scott Flahive's dream was to serve his community as a law enforcement officer. After graduating from Grand Haven High School in 1985, he received a degree in criminal justice from Grand Valley State University. Scott worked part time for three summers as a Grand Haven police department foot patrol officer and became a full time Public Safety Officer in May of 1994. On December 13, 1994, Scott was killed in the line of duty by an escapee from the Ottawa County Jail, located in Grand Haven at the time. Scott was only twenty-eight years old. Officer Flahive was lovingly remembered by his family, his community, and his fellow police officers. Scott's family and the Grand Haven Public Safety Department created this fund to assist local high school graduates to pursue studies in the field of law enforcement or criminal justice.

Vernon J. and Shirley M. Hipwell Family Music Scholarship Fund



Hofma Scholarship Fund



Hoffman Family Scholarship Fund




